TRAIL CORRIDORS + LOOPS

TRAIL CORRIDORS	CHARACTERISTICS
BIG DRY CREEK TRAIL	This multi-use regional trail along Big Dry Creek provides opportunities to view wildlife such as coyotes, fox and raptors, and experience a variety of landscapes, while enjoying expansive views of the Front Range. An underpass at I-25 west of Thornton Creek Golf Course provides connectivity to the Big Dry Creek Trail in Westminister and further downstream approximately 11.5 miles to Stanley Lake Regional Park.
BRANTNER GULCH TRAIL	This trail connects the 107-acre Eastlake #3 Park & Nature Preserve to Northaven Park near Holly Street and will eventually connect further east to Adams County Regional Park.
FARMER'S HIGH LINE CANAL TRAIL	This multi-use trail provides regional connection to Northglenn and Westminister. It is approximately 10.5 miles from the trail at 128th Avenue and Lafayette Street west to Stanley Lake Regional Park. At 120th Avenue, the trail connects to the Signal Ditch Trail heading north.
GRANGE HALL CREEK TRAIL	This multi-use trail provides a wonderful east/west corridor through the City linking large parks and open space areas to each other and the South Platte River Trail.
HORIZON TRIBUTARY TRAIL	This trail connects Springvale Park (disc golf course) to Marshall Lake Park and Glen Eagle Open Space. When the corridor is complete, it will connect the northern portion of Thornton to Adams County Regional Park.
LEE LATERAL TRAIL (HERITAGE TRAIL)	This east/west regional trail corridor comes off the Signal Ditch Trail at York Street and provides connection to Eastlake #3 Park & Nature Preserve and Thornton Trail Winds Park & Open Space. The trail serves as part of the Eastlake Heritage Trail Loop.
LAKEVIEW TRIBUTARY TRAIL	This trail corridor connects the Lee Lateral Trail, Eagleview Park and Thornton Trail Winds Park & Open Space to the Brantner Gulch Trail via Woodbridge Station and Sage Creek Parks.
NIVER CREEK TRAIL	The southernmost Thornton trail corridor connects Pecos Park to the 65-acre Niver Open Space, then connects to Adams County's Niver Canyon Trail and approximately 1.25 miles to the South Platte River Trail in unincorporated Adams County.
PLAINS TRIBUTARY TRAIL	This corridor will eventually connect Thornton Trail Winds Park & Open Space to the Brantner Gulch Trail.
PREBLE CREEK TRAIL	This northernmost trail corridor runs along Preble Creek in the the North Creek Farms Subdivision. The trail will eventually connect east to the Big Dry Creek Regional Trail.
SIGNAL DITCH TRAIL	This trail corridor takes off from the Farmer's High Line Canal Trail at 128th Avenue and Lafayette Street northeast towards the City limits. The trail connects Cherrywood Park, Lake Village Park, and Fallbrook Farms Park. The Northern Lights Ball Fields and Eastlake #3 Park and Nature Preserve are accessible from the Signal Ditch Trail through local connector trails. The Signal Ditch Trail also connects into the Lee Lateral regional trail system.
SOUTH PLATTE RIVER TRAIL	This South Platte River corridor is a significant natural feature that buffers the City of Thornton's eastern boundary. The multi-use regional trail connects the City of Thornton to downtown Denver and Chaffield or Cherry Creek Reservoir.
UNION DITCH TRAIL	This central east/west corridor provides regional connectivity into Northglenn, and connects Woodglenn/Brookshire Park to Skylake Ranch Open Land.
PROPOSED E-470 TRAIL	Regional trail proposed along E-470 would connect Thornton to Broomfield and Commerce City.
LOOPS	CHARACTERISTICS
MARGARET W. CARPENTER PARK & OPEN SPACE LOOPS (Map Loc. - E8)	CARPENTER PARK FIELDS LOOP - 0.8 MILES A popular loop with walkers, runners, and roller-bladers who like to exercise outdoors while enjoying expansive views of the Colorado Front Range. OUTER LOOP - 2.0 MILES Departing from the Margaret W. Carpenter Recreation Center, this loop provides walkers and runners the opportunity to go a greater distance on hard and soft surface trails around Thornton's signature park.
EASTLAKE #3 PARK & NATURE PRESERVE LOOP (Map Loc. - E6)	1.5 MILES A soft-surface loop trail surrounding the reservoir provides an opportunity for Thornton residents to experience open space and wildlife in the middle of the city.
HUNTERS GLEN PARK LOOP (Map Loc. - D5)	0.75 MILES This multi-use trail loops around the beautiful Hunters Glen Lake providing opportunities for bird watching and to enjoy views of the Front Range.

located at 112th Avenue and Colorado Boulevard, the **Margaret W. Carpenter Recreation Center** is a state-of-the-art facility with a wide variety of amenities including pools, exercise equipment, gyms, banquet rooms, preschool and daycare facilities and much more.

Directly south of the recreation center, the **Carpenter Park Multipurpose Fields** host many sports teams events and practices as well as annual community gatherings such as the **Frontonfest**, the 4th of July Celebration and Winterfest.

The **0.8 mile loop** surrounding the fields is popular with walkers, joggers, and roller-bladers while the **2 mile outer loop** around the entire park is perfect for those who want to go a greater distance. Both loops provide expansive views of the Colorado Front Range. ►



Directly behind the recreation center is **Carpenter Park**, open to the public from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. Park amenities include paddle boat rentals, indoor carousel, outdoor amphitheater, birthday party room, spray ground, playground, skatepark, basketball courts, sand volleyball courts, bocce ball courts, horseshoe pits, shuffleboard, lighted tennis courts, pavilions, picnic areas and trails.

The **Carousel**, **Sprayground** and **Boat Rental** operations are open seasonally from Memorial Day to Labor Day, as well as weekends in May and September. Birthday packages are offered during the summer season.

The **Amphitheater** and two larger **Pavilions** are available to rent for private events. For more information, please call 303-255-7800.

THE OVERALL VISION IS TO CREATE AN INTEGRATED SYSTEM OF PARKS, RECREATION FACILITIES, TRAILS, AND OPEN SPACE THAT WILL:

- ★ PROVIDE RECREATIONAL AND CULTURAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL RESIDENTS,
- ★ BE EQUITABLY DISTRIBUTED, TO THE EXTENT POSSIBLE, THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY,
- ★ CONNECT NEIGHBORHOODS, PARKS, SCHOOLS, RECREATION FACILITIES, AND BUSINESS DISTRICTS,
- ★ PRESERVE THE HERITAGE AND QUALITY OF LIFE IN THORNTON,
- ★ ENHANCE AND BUILD UPON THORNTON'S ENVIRONMENTAL ASSETS, AND
- ★ ENHANCE THE COMMUNITY'S IDENTITY.

BIKE SAFETY

- Cyclists have the same rights and responsibilities as motorists. Under state law, bicyclists are considered vehicles. Cyclists should obey all traffic laws, signs and signals.
- Always ride with the flow of traffic. It's the law and safer for you. Motorists, pedestrians, and other cyclists do not expect to see you riding against traffic, and your chance of having an accident increases dramatically.
- Stay to the right as much as possible when riding and use bike lanes and paved shoulders when available.
- Use hand signals to indicated turns, lane changes and stops. Signal before, not while you make your move.
- Be visible. Wear brightly colored clothing and use a headlight, taillight and reflectors at night.
- Remember, pedestrians have the right-of-way when they are crossing the street.

COMMUNITY PARK

Community Park, located at 95th Avenue and York Street, provides a variety of recreational experiences for residents living in the southern end of the City, as well as hosting community celebrations such as the annual Harvest Fest in September.

The **Thornton Community Center**, located at Epping
Boulevard and Gaylord Street, was constructed in 1973.
This 27,000 square foot facility includes a two-court
gymnasium, weight room, dance room, senior billiards room, and
classroom/conference room. A multipurpose room was converted
into a **Teen Center** in January 2004.

Thornton's Skate Park and City Pool are located at Community Park. In 2004, City Pool was renovated with water slides, lazy river, play structure and three-lane lap pool. The pool is open seasonally and the skate park is open year-round from sunrise to sunset.

- ✦ 117 miles of off-street trails
- ✦ Over 20 miles of on-street bike lanes
- ✦ 17.5 acres/1,000 residents of parks and open space currently open to the public
- ✦ One 72-par Championship Golf Course (Thorncreek Golf Course)
- ✦ Numerous recreational amenities including lighted tennis courts, multi-purpose fields, indoor and outdoor swimming pools, playgrounds, skate parks, disc golf course, dog park, fishing, recreation centers and gymnasiums offering recreation opportunities for people for all ages and activity levels.



FISHING FACILITIES

Fishing opportunities are available throughout the City of Thornton including the following popular locations:

- ★ **Grandview Ponds Open Space and Prairie Dog Habitat** is open year-round and hosts the annual Harvest Fest Fishing Derby in September.
- ★ **West Gravel Lakes Fishing Facility** is open seasonally (open March 15th through October 31st).

Additional fishing is available at Cherry Park, Civic Center Park, Hunters Glen Park, Lambertson Lakes Park & Open Space, Margaret W. Carpenter Park & Open Space, and Marshall Lake Park. All of these facilities allow live bait, flies and lures.

Colorado State Fishing Regulations apply - (<http://wildlife.state.co/RegRules/Regulations/>). Any special fishing regulations are provided on site signage and Colorado State fishing licenses are required.

PAVILION RENTALS

Park pavilions can be reserved for a private event at the following parks: Cherry Park, Cherrywood Park, Community Park, North Star Park, Thornton Trail Winds Park & Open Space (West and East), Woodglen Park, and Yorkborough Park.

Pavilions can be rented for a fee and are permitted from April 1 through October 31. Beginning November 1 through March 31 each year, pavilions are available at no charge and on a first-come, first-served basis. No rental applications will be accepted after 12 p.m.(noon) on Wednesday for a pavilion rental on that same weekend. Full day pavilion rentals are for weekend and holiday use only. Half-day rentals are available for weekdays only. For more information on renting any one of these pavilions, call 303-255-7830.
